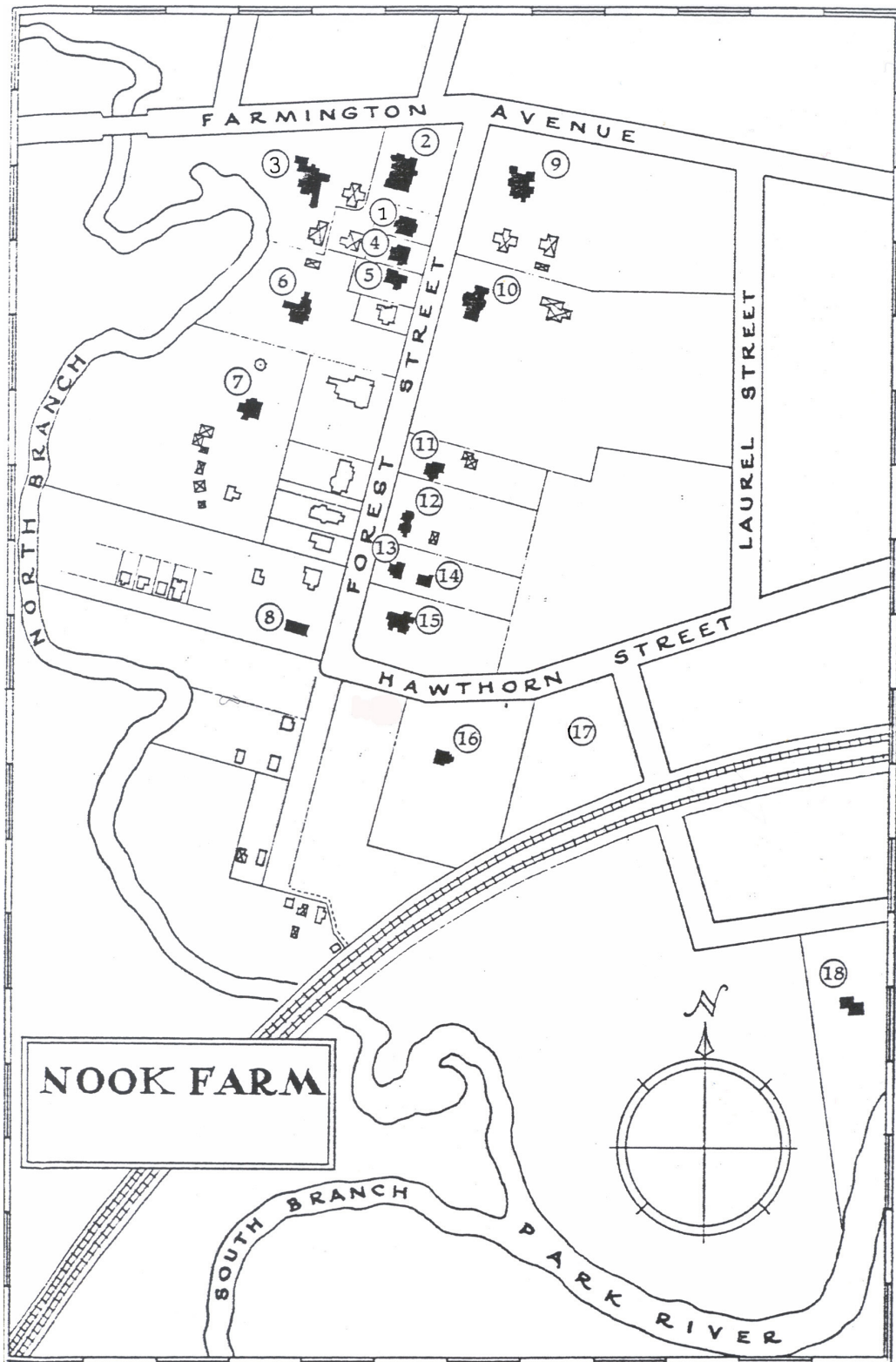


Nook Farm Map



Key to *Nook Farm* Map

The houses in solid black had been built by 1885; those in single-line outline were built later; buildings with X indicate barns, carriage houses and greenhouses. South Marshall Street, which now runs north and south between Forest and Laurel Streets, did not exist in 1885.

14. Mrs. Edward Hooker residence.
15. **Hooker House**, built 1853.

18. “**Oakholm**”, first Stowe House, built 1864.
